Stacie Lenear-Carver, St. Petersburg College

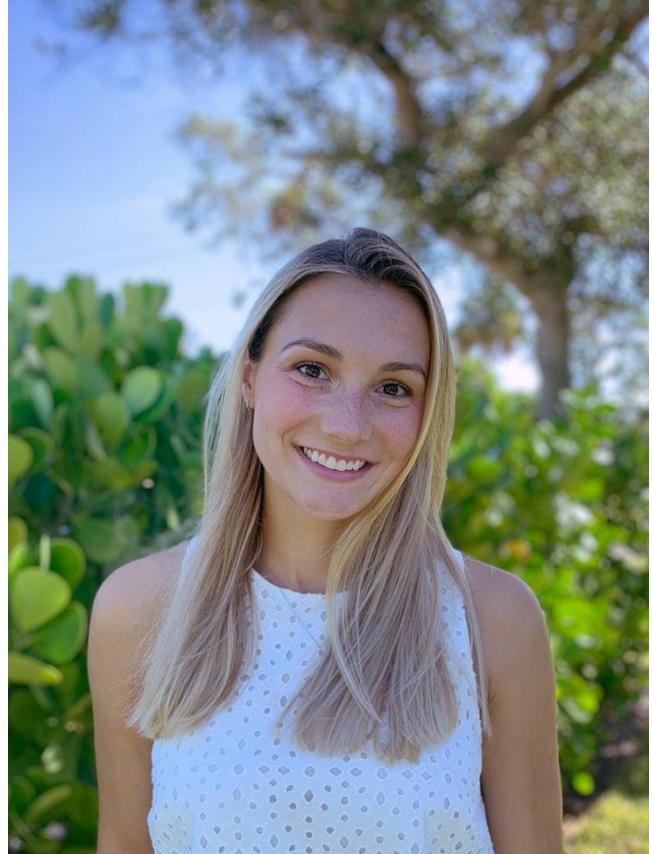
